My Overall Vision for AAMP:

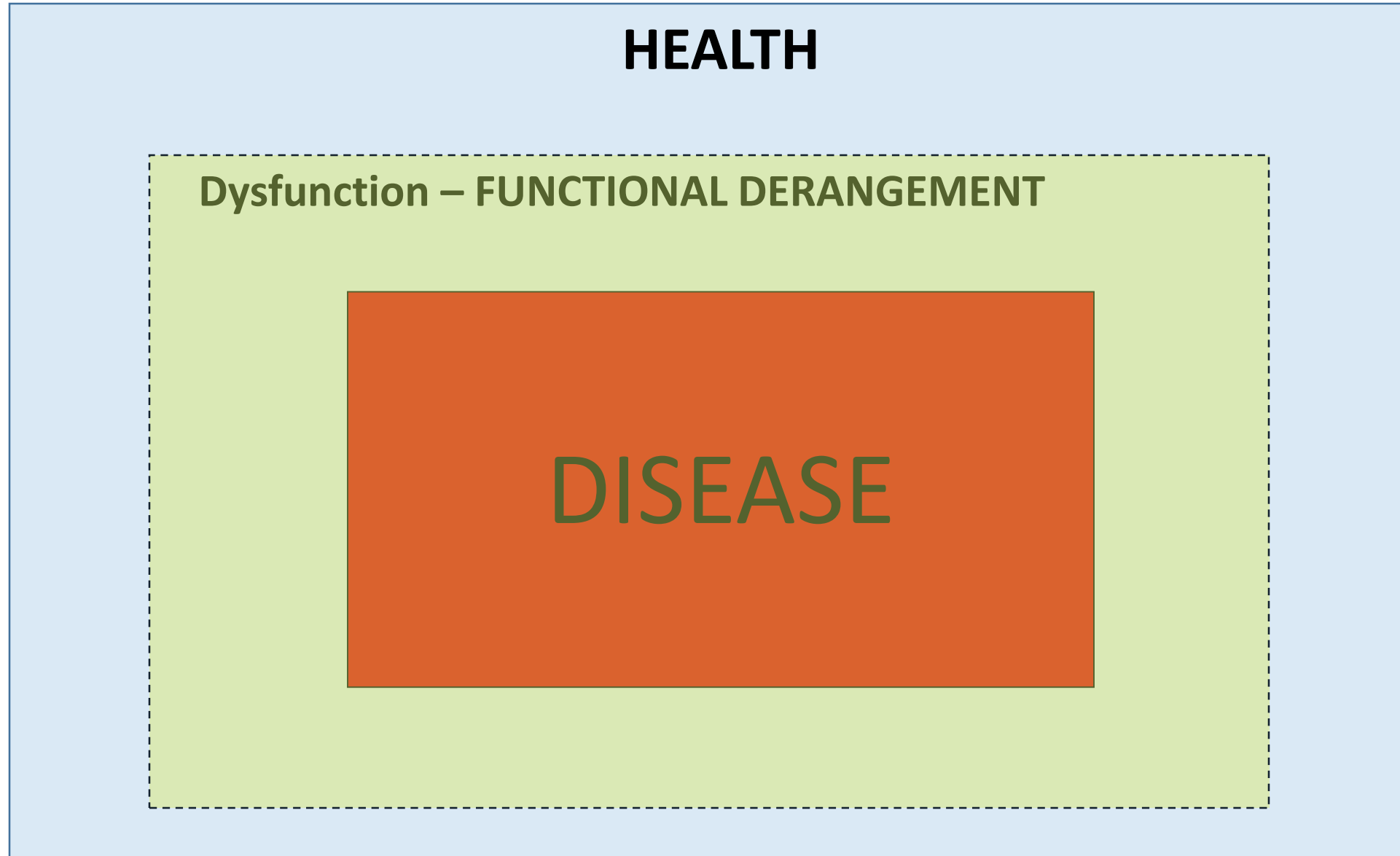

Disease – vs – Functional Problem



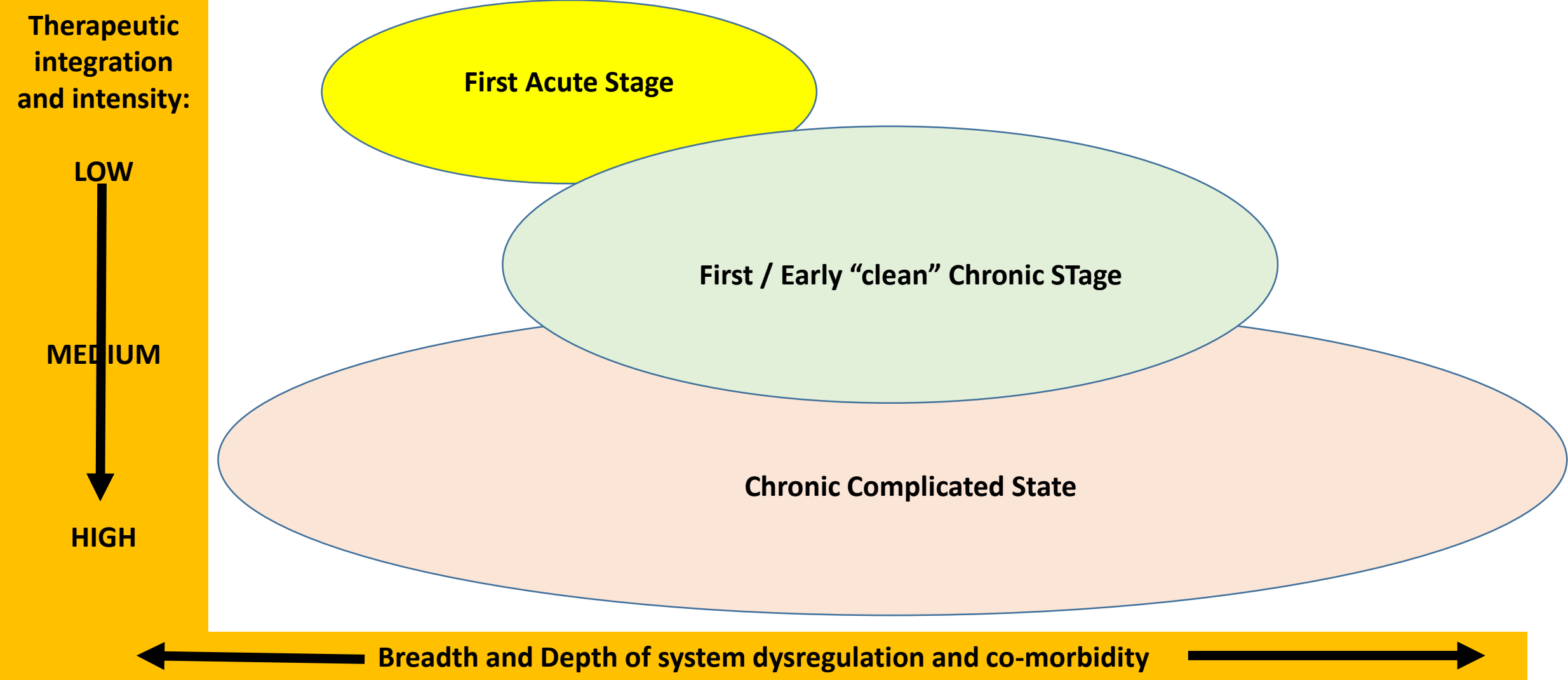
Disease – vs – Functional Problem



Three level "strata" of chronic illness:

- First / Acute Stage
 - Treated as an acute and should respond as such
 - Watch for slow responders
 - May be sicker than you realize
- First / Early "clean" Chronic Stage
 - Unless fits criteria for the next phase – more of a simple case
 - Easier therapy and resolution
 - Mitochondrial and collateral endocrine or other system support may be only a transient need
- Chronic Complicated Illness
 - Co-infections Immune dysregulation assured
 - Biofilms assured
 - Mitochondrial damage assured
 - Toxins assured
 - Endocrine dysregulation assured
 - Etc...

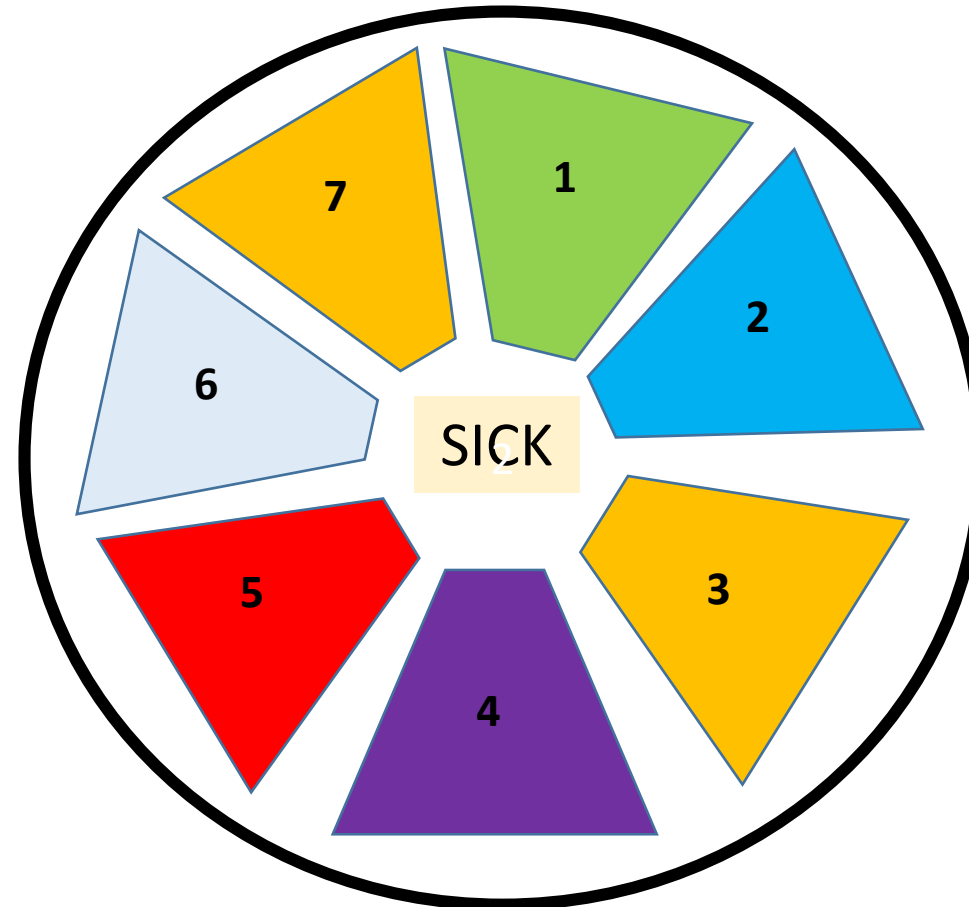

Effectors:

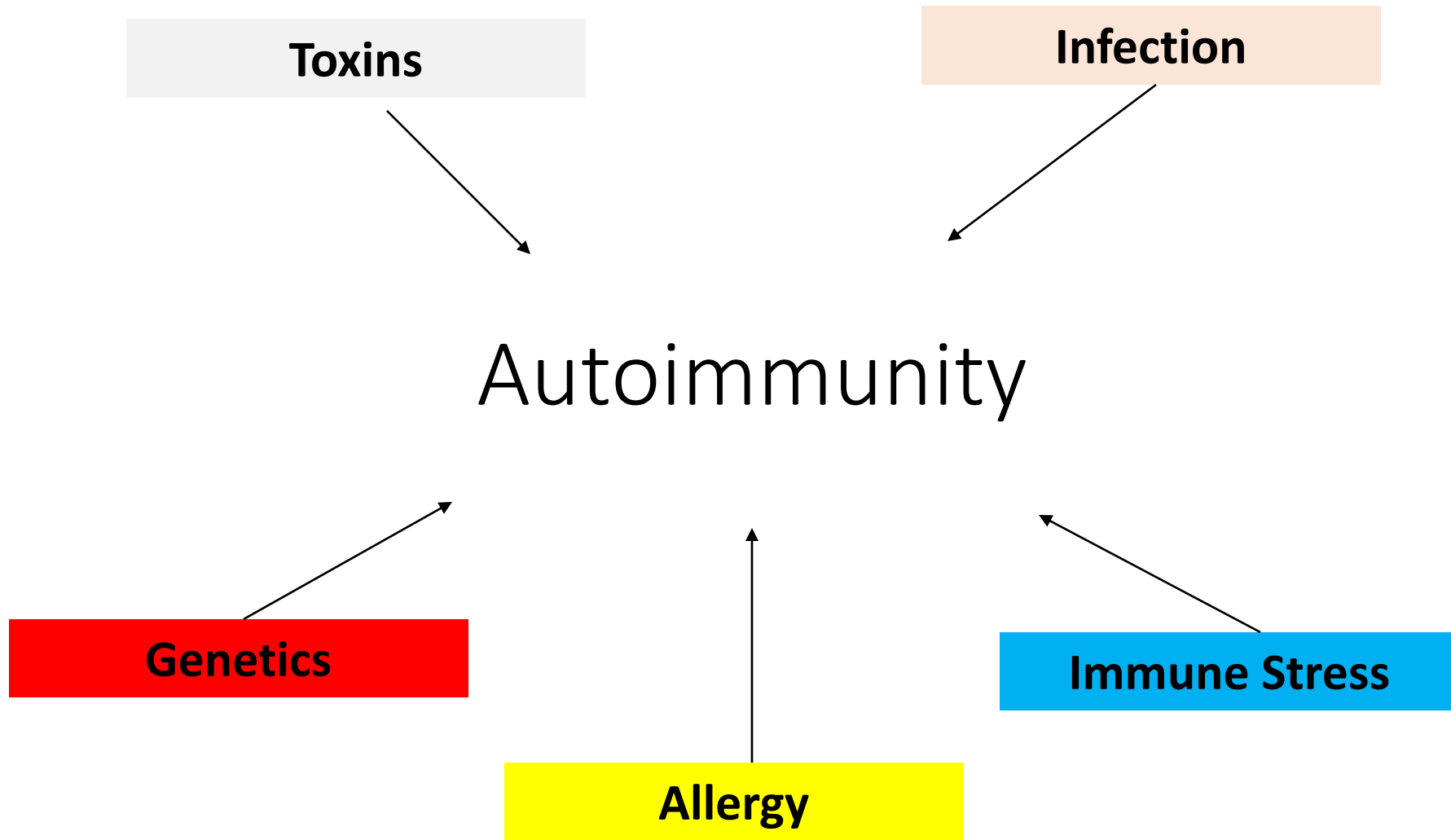
1. Cell & Physical Function
2. Toxins
3. Biofilms
4. Immunology
5. Endocrine
6. Psychosocial
7. Digestive - GI



Note:

Chronic Disease of any kind (in the absence of genetic or acquired immune deficiency) is never a single issue. In some proportion the effectors listed feed into the terrain that allows the chronic illness to exist.

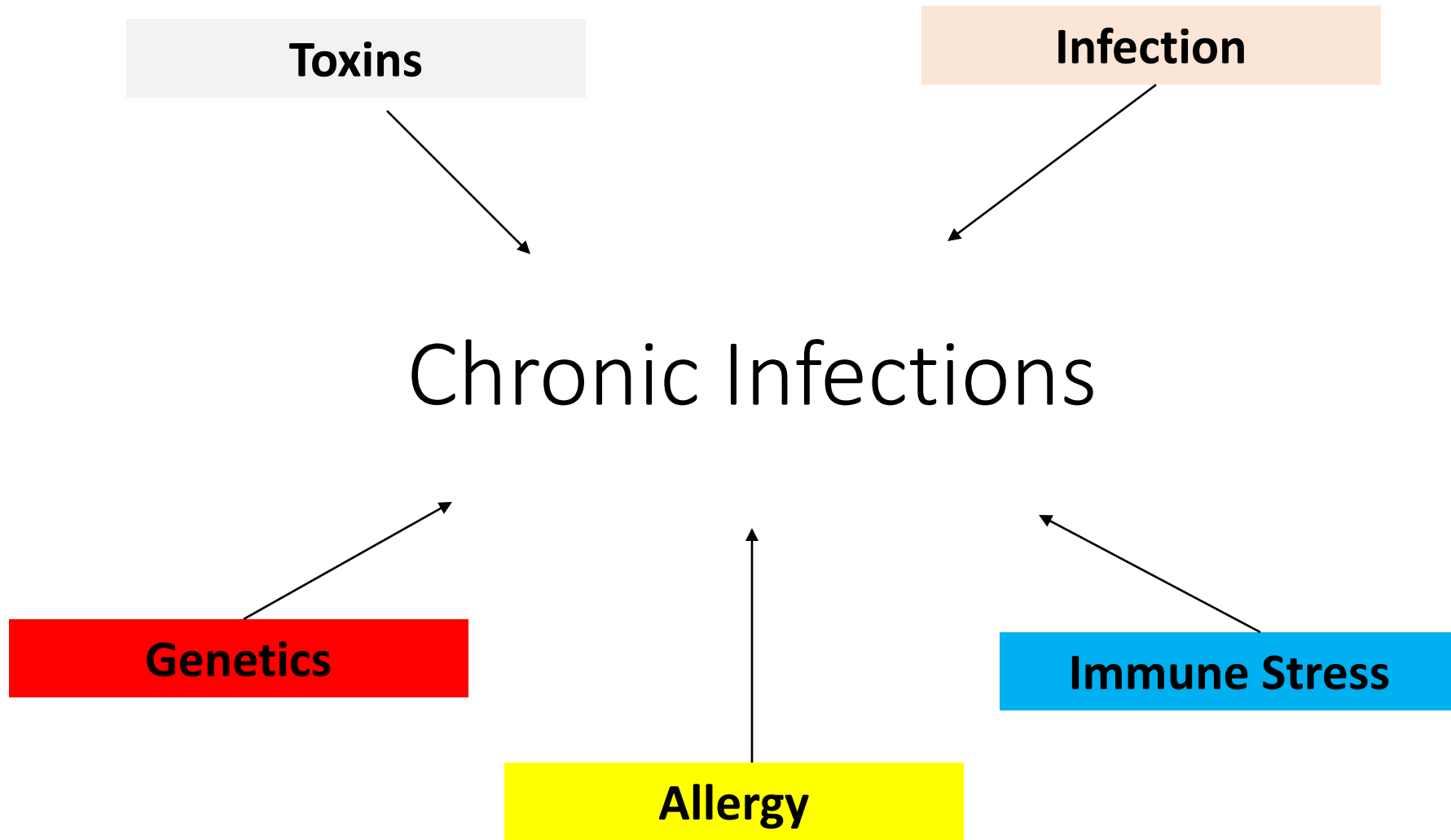

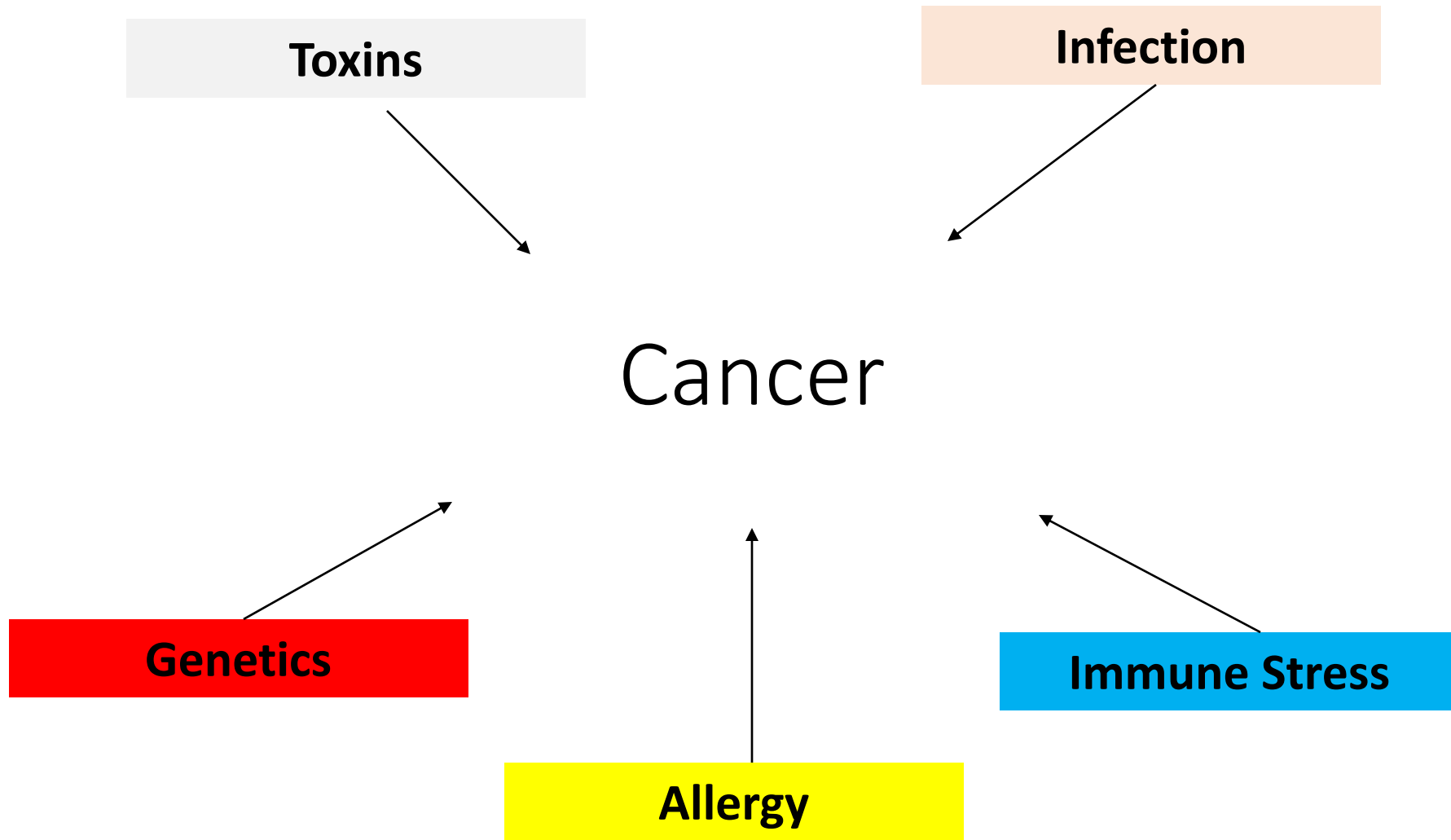

Summary

Autoimmunity occurs when the immune system recognizes and attacks host tissue. In addition to genetic factors, environmental triggers (in particular viruses, bacteria and other infectious pathogens) are thought to play a major role in the development of autoimmune diseases. In this review, we (i) describe the ways in which an infectious agent can initiate or exacerbate autoimmunity; (ii) discuss the evidence linking certain infectious agents to autoimmune diseases in humans; and (iii) describe the animal models used to study the link between infection and autoimmunity.
